LIBRARY CATALOGUE AND ELECTRONIC DATABASES

To find books, journals, and audiovisual materials on your topic, search the library's online **catalogue**. If you are looking for journal articles, search the library's online **journal article indexes & electronic databases**. Use **keywords** to search the online catalogue and/or electronic databases. A keyword is a word or term that best describes the information you are

looking for. You can search the library catalogue or an electronic database for either a single keyword or a combination of keywords in order to find articles in an electronic database or books in the online catalogue containing the keyword(s).

Examples of keywords:

bundle theory	functionalism	natural law theory	philosophy of psychology

Academic Search Premier: A multi-disciplinary database providing full text journal coverage for social sciences, humanities, education, computer sciences, arts and literature, medical science, and ethnic studies. Fulltext. Updated monthly. 1984-current

Canadian MAS Fulltext: All subjects, popular focus, some Canadian coverage, 1984-current.

CBCA Fulltext Reference: Canadian Business and Current Affairs is a major index for Canadian newspapers, popular & business scholarly journal and popular magazines. 1982- present.

CPI.Q: Provides coverage of current events, health, technology, arts, history, culture, and business. 400 Canadian periodicals with 137 fulltext. 1988-present.

Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) - "Categorized, searchable links to free, full text, quality controlled scientific and scholarly journals": <http://www.doaj.org/>

Humanities Index: Literature, sociology, anthropology, geography, etc. 1983-current. Updated monthly.

Ingenta: Indexes over 17,000 scholarly journals in all subject areas.

MAS Ultra: Contains full text for nearly 550 magazines, 91,600 biographies, 75,000 primary source documents, and 250 reference books. 1984 - current.

Modern Language Association: A bibliography of journal articles, books and dissertations published by the MLA. I

Readers Guide to Periodical Literature: Subjects include popular literature, current events, business, fashion, politics, crafts, foods, sports, history & science. 1983-current.

Social Science Index: Indexes journals in the Social Sciences
