HD Hyundai Electric donates \$100,000

NLC has long been the home of oil and gas training in the region, thanks in part to the creation of the Centre of Training Excellence in Oil and Gas (CTEOG). With the development of clean energy technologies, carbon capture and storage, and the application of Al to the energy sector, the natural progression is to bring other energies under the CTEOG umbrella, including hydro, wind, solar, and geothermal.

A longtime friend of Darcy, Wayde felt donating




to the welding program was a way he could help advance the education of the students. "It's awesome!" said Darcy.
