Objectives


Formed in 1981, the Northern Lights College Foundation has four main objectives:

Women's Under 18 National Championship

In November, the Foundation had the amazing opportunity to raise funds for NLC Athletics by hosting the 50/50 for the U18 Women's National Championship held at the Ovintiv Events Centre in Dawson Creek.

Community Giving Fund

As a way to continue giving back to our community, the Northern Lights College Foundation has created a new fund.

The NLC Community Giving Fund allows your thoughtful contributions to make a tangible impact in our communities. This fund was developed to support various organizations within our service areas, ensuring donations are directed toward local charities and non-profits.

Within our college community, a dedicated effort was made to formulate a strategic plan that aligns with our values, and one of the key pillars identified in this plan is Community Connections. At NLC, we firmly believe in our role as a community hub, emphasizing our commitment to giving back to our community, particularly to those in need.

This year, thanks to the generous contributions from both staff and the wider community, the Foundation purchased \$750 in gift certificates from the NLC Salon and Spa to be donated to local organizations. The benefit is two-fold; our students will gain hands-on experience, while community members in need will receive considerate care gifts.

In January, the NLC Salon and Spa shifted into a fully operational business, offering appointments to community members. This not only allowed our students to showcase their skills but also provided them with insights into the business side of their trade.

The NLC Community Giving Fund donated \$250 in gift certificates each to Networks Ministries, Nawican Friendship Centre, and Mizpah Transition House.

These organizations can distribute the certificates to individuals who can utilize them at the hair salon or spa, thereby receiving much-needed care during challenging times.

Tread for Trades

The snow may have been late, but Bannister Automotive in Dawson Creek was still able to donate \$7,370 to the Trades department, thanks to winter tire purchases and the Treads for Trades campaign.

Through November, Bannister Automotive collected \$5 from every tire purchased to support the trades programs at NLC. Aaron Powell, Executive Manager of Bannister, was grateful for this partnership.

"Being in the automotive industry, we are always looking to recruit and build and grow technicians, so we thought this was a good way we could give back to the program," he said.

They presented the giant cheque to NLC trades students, staff, and leadership on January 24, 2024, in the Trades Training Centre. Mark Heselwood, Bannister's General Manager, was impressed with the size of their donation.

"With the lack of snow, the amount of money we did raise was still astronomical. And we know we can build on it moving forward next year." The donation will go towards equipment and other expenses for the NLC trades students, some of which are dual credit students from our local high schools.

Lindsey Borek, Executive Director for the NLC Foundation, came up with the idea. She knew the partnership made sense and was overjoyed with the success of this initiative.

"We know that hands-on learning is the foundation of our trades programs. With this donation we can ensure our students have the materials they need to get the most out of their trades education. We are eternally grateful to Bannister Automotive and look forward to working with them again."

Ways to Donate to the Foundation



The NLC Foundation values donations that promote the success of students and the College. We have many opportunities for donors in a variety of different donation types. Our donors can contribute by way of One-Time Awards, Annual Awards, Endowment Awards, Legacy Gifts, and Gifts-In-Kind.

One-Time Award

(Minimum contribution of \$100) — A one-time donor's contribution would be awarded once.

Annual Award

(Minimum contribution of \$100) — Annual donors make a contribution once a year in support of a specific interest at Northern Lights College.

Endowment Award

(Minimum contribution of \$2,500) - Endowment donors make a gift of capital, which is held in trust, and the return rate (currently 4%*) from the capital donation affords an annual award in perpetuity.

Legacy Gift

You can make a difference for future generations of students with a gift in your will to Northern Lights College Foundation. Your legacy will have a powerful impact — increasing access to education, enhancing teaching and learning, and helping students succeed in our communities.
